English

This week in English we have been looking at Haiku poems. This has meant that we have been looking at syllables and how many syllables there are in different words. For example, in the word beautiful there are 3 syllables, flower has 2 and plant has 1. A Haiku poem has 5 syllables in the first line, 7 syllables in the second and 5 syllables in the third line.
